Uniform Series which is a way to study the Bible over a six-year period. Each quarter works its way through different books of the Bible and focuses on a different theme. As you study each passage of scripture you discover its deeper meaning and how it is relevant to our world today.

The Fall quarter, *God's Law Is Love*, looks at love in the context of God's law. The

lessons focus on New Testament texts that radically reinterpret the significance of the Mosaic law for those who love Christ and respond in faith.

She invites us to make a shift from a moral obligation to 'do right' to a deep desire for all beings to 'be right'—whole and

beloved. As we follow her lead into this theology of compassion, we come to notice that the world we have fallen in love with is our own. We discover that the 'rich, courageous, generous, and joyful' life Farley describes can be our own. This book gives us tools to make it so, helping us into practices of contemplation to center and guide us, opening deep wells of respite in these times of grief and joy.


Re-Introducing Highland's Church Library
