The rapid development of AI has taken the world by surprise, including AI experts, and it is raising many unprecedented questions (e.g., legal, ethical, and theological). In this talk, Professor Jung will reflect upon some of the ethical, metaphysical, and theological questions that are emerging in the new age of AI. Using the AI alignment problem as an example, Professor Jung will highlight both the challenges AI poses to contemporary moral life and the possible theological responses to these challenges.


Highland Worship Online

Parents' Conversation and Coffee, Room 126



Through Godly Play, drama, cinema, art, cooking, and movement, the children and their leaders draw closer to the stories of the Risen Christ.






Thursday Morning Women's Study
