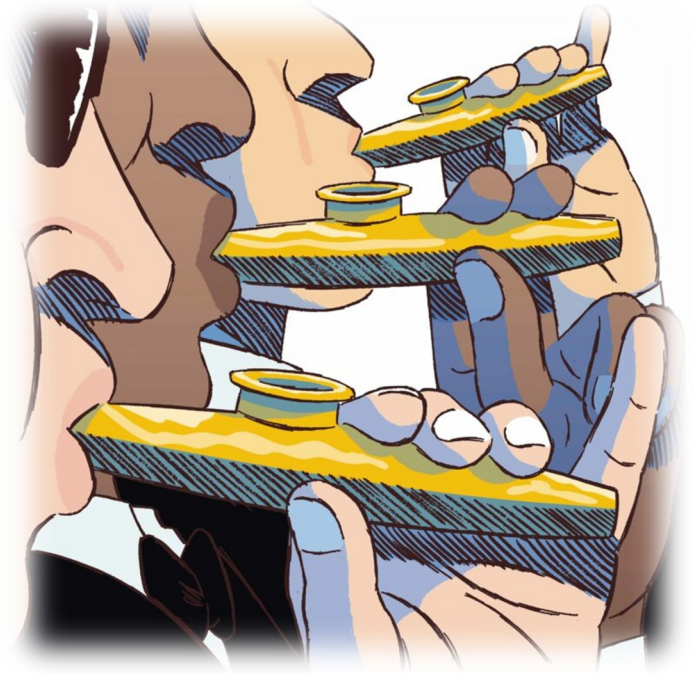


Tatakizome: Plant Hammering on Fabric

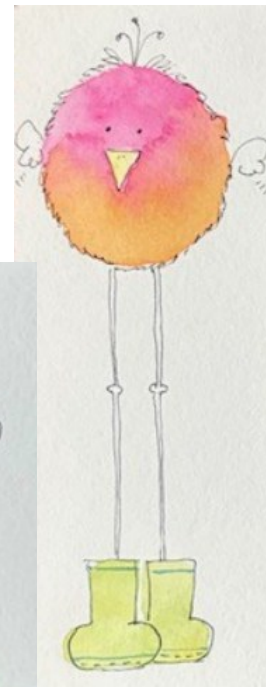
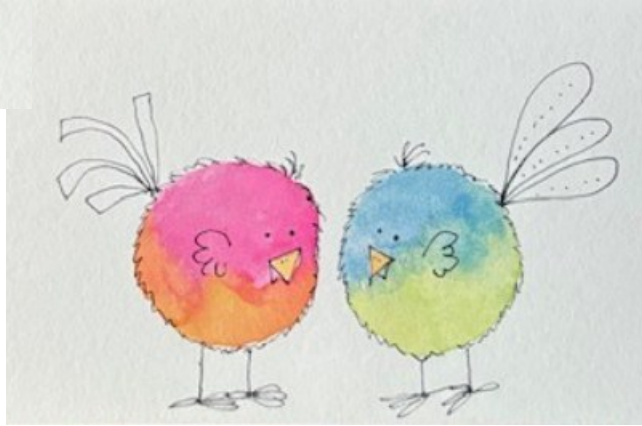
